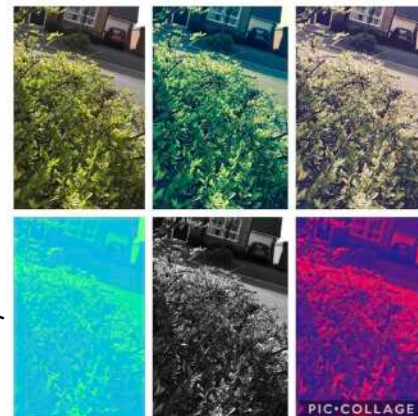

The basics A

Focus: what areas appear clearest or sharpest in the photograph? What do not? How would you describe the Depth of Field?

Foreground: the part of a scene or picture that is nearest to the viewer.

Background: the part of a scene or picture that is furthest from the viewer.

Composition: the arrangement or structure of the formal elements that make up an image.

Angle: the side in which the photo is taken.

Point of Interest: the subject, or what appears most prominently and/or most clearly.

Contrast: the value of an object or shape.

Contrast: strong visual differences between light and dark, varying textures, mass etc. Framing: what the photographer has placed within the boundaries of the photograph. Setting: actual physical surroundings or scenes whether real or artificial. Editing: the use of filters and apps to enhance an image.

Naturalism: close to the original.

Abstract: an image that emphasises formal elements.

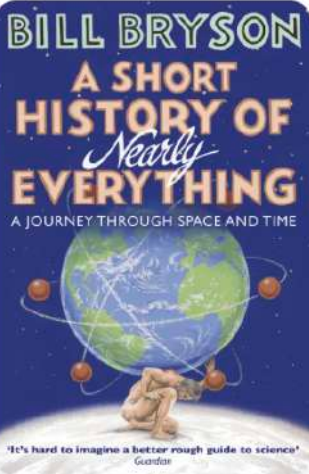

Well done to all of our wonderful RMS leaders and thank you so much to everyone who attended and helped make today a wonderful experience.





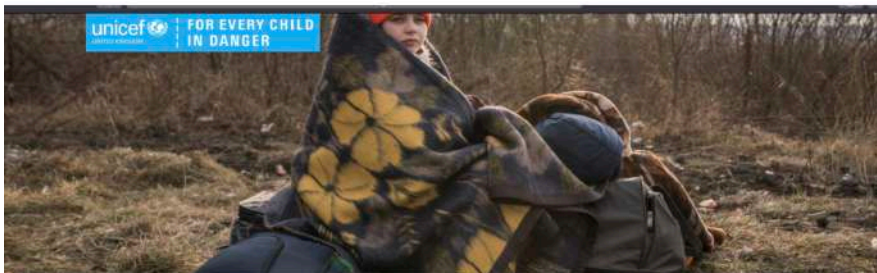

The following booklet will provide you with all the key information you need when you begin to consider option choices with your child. It is important to consider a number of factors when you come to making your choices:

Does my child enjoy this subject?

Has my child already shown potential in this subject?

Will my child be successful in this subject and be able to gain their highest possible grade?

Is the subject a good choice for my child and will it meet the needs of their post 16 education?

Options Evening is an opportunity to talk to subject teachers, learn more about the courses on offer and begin to consider what is the best route forward for your child. It is important that your child is happy with their choice as the optional subjects offer a range of skills that build on, and complement, the academic subjects that are compulsory.

Please feel free to ask as many questions as you need so that you feel confident that you have the information you require to make an informed choice.



What happens next?

Week Beginning 28th February– Myself and Mrs Till will meet with the year group and go through the next stages with them.

Week Beginning 7th March– Options Booklet go out to pupils and parents (with dates and information about the options evening). This will contain links to exam specifications, crucial knowledge and subject overviews.

Week Beginning 14th March – Year 8 Exams

Week Beginning 25th April and then Week Beginning 2nd May – Option Taster sessions for Year 8 (timetable will be sent to them beforehand). This will give them an idea of what to expect in each subject.

27th April – Pupil progress grades to be sent out.

28th April – Year 8 Parents Evening – Maths, Science, English and Languages (this will probably be virtual via Teams). This will give you an insight into these subjects going into their GCSE years and an overview on progress and attitude to learning.

Week Beginning 2nd May – Option Blocks will be released to pupils and parents

5th May - Options Evening and official forms given (6:00pm – 8:30pm). This will be an 'in person' event and will give you chance to talk to staff and ask any questions. We are also hosting a careers event on this evening for Year 8 where they will have an opportunity to talk to colleges, employers and providers. Even though this is early, it is always good for them to think about what is available to them in their futures.

Roman Chesterton



The Romans invaded Britain in AD43 with an invasion force of four legions (about 24,000 men) as well as a large number of auxiliary troops. In three years, they had conquered most of the south and east of Britain; forming a border roughly from the mouth of the Humber River to Lyme Bay. From there they quickly moved to conquer the lands of the Cornovii, which included Staffordshire.

To support the expanding Roman Empire, a network of roads was constructed and forts placed at intervals of a day's march were built along them.

In Chesterton such a fort was built late in the first century and was probably occupied until the third century. It was situated on the Mount Pleasant hill, on the site of our school and was rectangular in shape, as was typical for a Roman fort. In 1969 excavations revealed that it consisted of a 6 metre (20ft) wide rampart surrounded by two ditches and covered an area of almost 20 acres.(over 11 football pitches).

The fort stood astride a Roman road which ran from Derventio (Little Chester, near Derby) via Rocester. Excavations locally have revealed a sandstone-paved section of the road in the grounds of Wolstanton High School. Further evidence shows that the road crossed Wolstanton Golf course and entered Chesterton, close to the junction between London Road and the A34. The road then continued on towards Middlewich, although the exact route that it took out of Chesterton is currently uncertain

(thanks to Apedale Heritage Centre).
