Revision Strategies

Brain Dump

Choose a topic and write down as much as you can remember, without referring to your notes. Check your notes and see what you missed then try fill the gaps without the notes. Check your notes a third time and add the missing information.

Flash Cards

Write flash cards for each topic, in all subjects, then mix them up for the most effective revision. Check out the Leitner System for effective spacing and interleaving. Keep your flash cards simple - one question, one answer per card.

Map it out 88

Take an essay question or writing question and map out your answer, without writing a full response. Look at the mark scheme and deicide if you plan meets the criteria. DO this for a number of questions, then choose one and write the full response.

Past Papers

Ask your teacher for practice questions or exam papers or find them on the exam board website. Complete them without notes in the exam conditions, then check you answers and identify the gaps in your knowledge, so you can target your revision.

Quizzes

Write a set of questions and answers and ask someone to test you. Its important to either write or say your answers loud. Reading through quizzes in your head can give you a false sense of security.

Thinking Hard: Reduce Ľ

Read a section of your notes then put them aside and reduce what you need into 3 bullet points, each one no more than 10 words. Look back at the notes and decide if you missed anything important. Hide the notes and write a fourth bullet point.

Practice Introductions

For essay subjects, tale a past exam question and practice writing effective introductions and conclusion. Look back at your notes and remind yourself of the important things to remember. Practice for different topics, texts and papers.

Thinking Hard: Connect

For each subject, consider the exam paper and group together questions that require the same technique to answer. Write down the requirements for each type. Find a previous example you have completed and identify where you've met the criteria.

Thinking Hard: Transform

Read a paragraph from your notes or a text book, and transform it into a diagram, chart or sketch – no words allowed. OR Look a diagram in science, for example, and transform it into a paragraph of explanation.

Key Vocabulary

For a particular topic, make a list of key vocabulary, then do the following: define each word; use each term in a sentence; create a question where the key word is the answer; identify other words which connect to each of the words in your list.

Use the revision resources in your class Teams Files. Your teachers will add and update a range of resources for you to use for your revision.







Tips for Youth to Stop Violence and Abuse

- Tell someone. If you are the victim or are witness to violence, tell someone. It can be anyone you trust, such as a friend, parent, teacher, older brother/sisters.
- Take all violence and abuse seriously. Remember that many acts of violence and abuse are against the law.
- Take a stand. If you witness any form of violence or abuse, stand up, step in, or shout out that the offender is actually the uncool one, and the violence has to stop.
- Be an individual. Think for yourself. Don't follow the crowd and don't give into peer pressure. Don't participate in any forms of violence or abuse just because your friends are.
- Take back the power. Offenders act violently or abusively to gain power. By not participating, you take the power away from the offender and pass it to the victim.
- Remember, putting others down doesn't raise you up. There is never a good reason to be abusive or violent towards anyone.
- Wrong. 24/7. Violence and abuse of any type that happens at any time is wrong. Period.
- Be a friend. Help the person who is being abused by inviting them to participate in school activities. This will take away the feeling of being alone.
- Spread the word. Comfort the person who was hurt and make it known that what happened was not fair or deserved.
- 10. Stay cool. Try not to respond to violence with anger. Anger can make things worse.



The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence is an annual international campaign that kicks off on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and runs until 10 December, Human Rights Day.

In support of this civil society initiative, the United Nations Secretary-General's UNITE by 2030 to End Violence against Women campaign (UNITE campaign) calls for global actions to increase awareness, galvanize advocacy efforts, and share knowledge and innovations.

The global theme for this year's 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence, which will run from 25 November to 10 December 2022, is "UNITE! Activism to end violence against women and girls".

The **colour orange** continues to be a key tool unifying all activities to bring global attention to the initiative.
