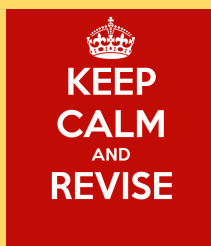

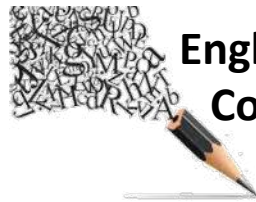
KW: 9/1X = Massive improvement towards unseen poetry as a class, turning into absolute poetry superstars!!

Football News.

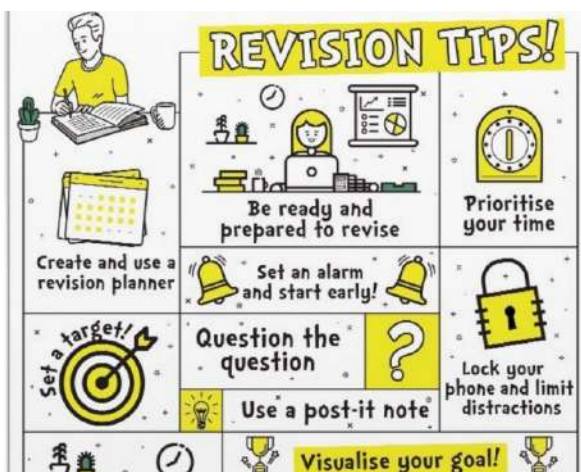

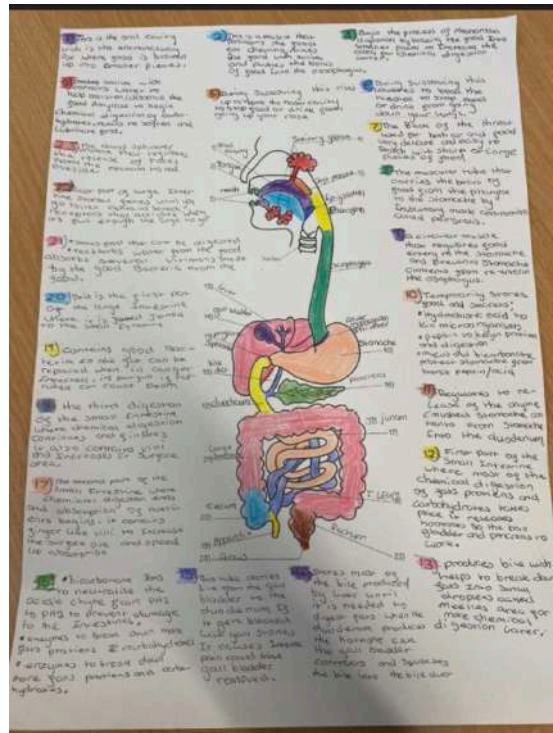

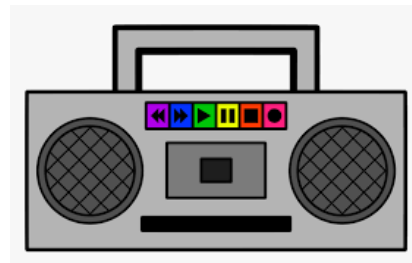
