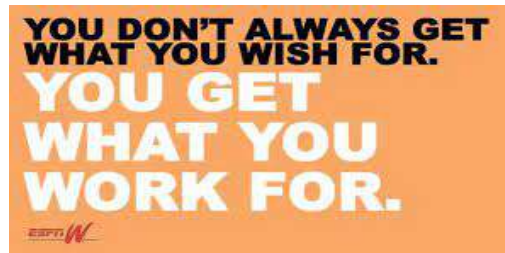

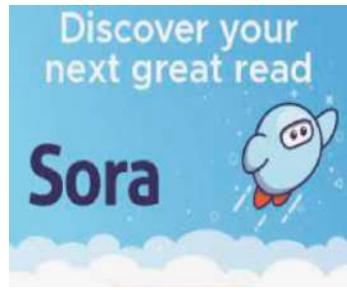

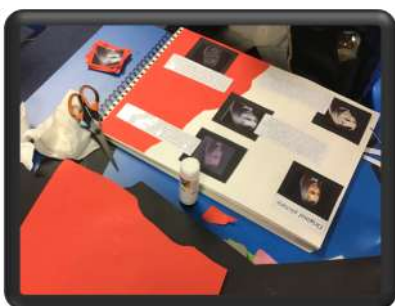

Key Information

Mary Seacole wanted to help injured soldiers who were fighting in the crimean war so she asked the war office if she could go help the wounded soldiers but she wasn't allowed! so she raised the money herself and travelled to Balaklava, ukraine. Here, she looked after British soldiers who had been injured. despite all that she did, not many people know who she was or the amazing work that she had done after she died. Most people remember Florence Nightingale, who helped many people too. In 2016, a statue of her was built outside St Thomas' Hospital in London.

Background

She was born and raised in Jamaica on 23 November 1805, this was during the period when many black people in the Caribbean were forced to work as slaves. Although Mary's mother was black, her father James Grant was a white Scottish army officer and Mary was born a 'free person'. She came over to England in 1854

Achievements

Mary Seacole is best remembered as the nurse who set up a "British Hotel" all by herself during the Crimean War to care for the sick and wounded soldiers. She provided food, medicines and other supplies to the injured and convalescent servicemen and served them selflessly.



Challenges

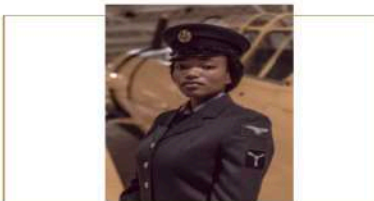
Mary Seacole faced unfairness and discrimination as a black woman when she tried to volunteer as a nurse during the Crimean War (1854-56). When the British turned down her offer of help, she decided to go to the Crimea independently.

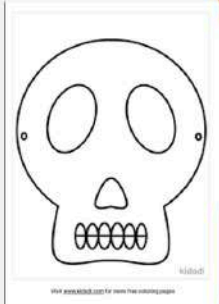


The Day of The Dead is a Mexican holiday which celebrates loved ones who have passed away.

Día de los Muertos

The Day of the Dead is a Mexican holiday where families welcome back the souls of relatives who have passed away for a reunion that includes food, drink and celebration. It is celebrated each year from 31st October (Halloween) until 2nd November (Day of the Dead). According to tradition, the gates of heaven are opened at midnight on Halloween and the spirits of children can rejoin their families for 24 hours – the spirits of adults can do the same the next day. During this holiday, the souls of the dead return to the living world to feast, drink, dance and play music with their loved ones. In turn, the living family members leave the deceased their favourite foods and other offerings on the ofrendas built in their homes. Ofrendas can be decorated with candles, bright marigolds and food like stacks of tortillas and fruit. The most famous symbols related to El Día de los Muertos are skulls (calaveras). People commonly wear skull masks and eat edible sugar skulls.

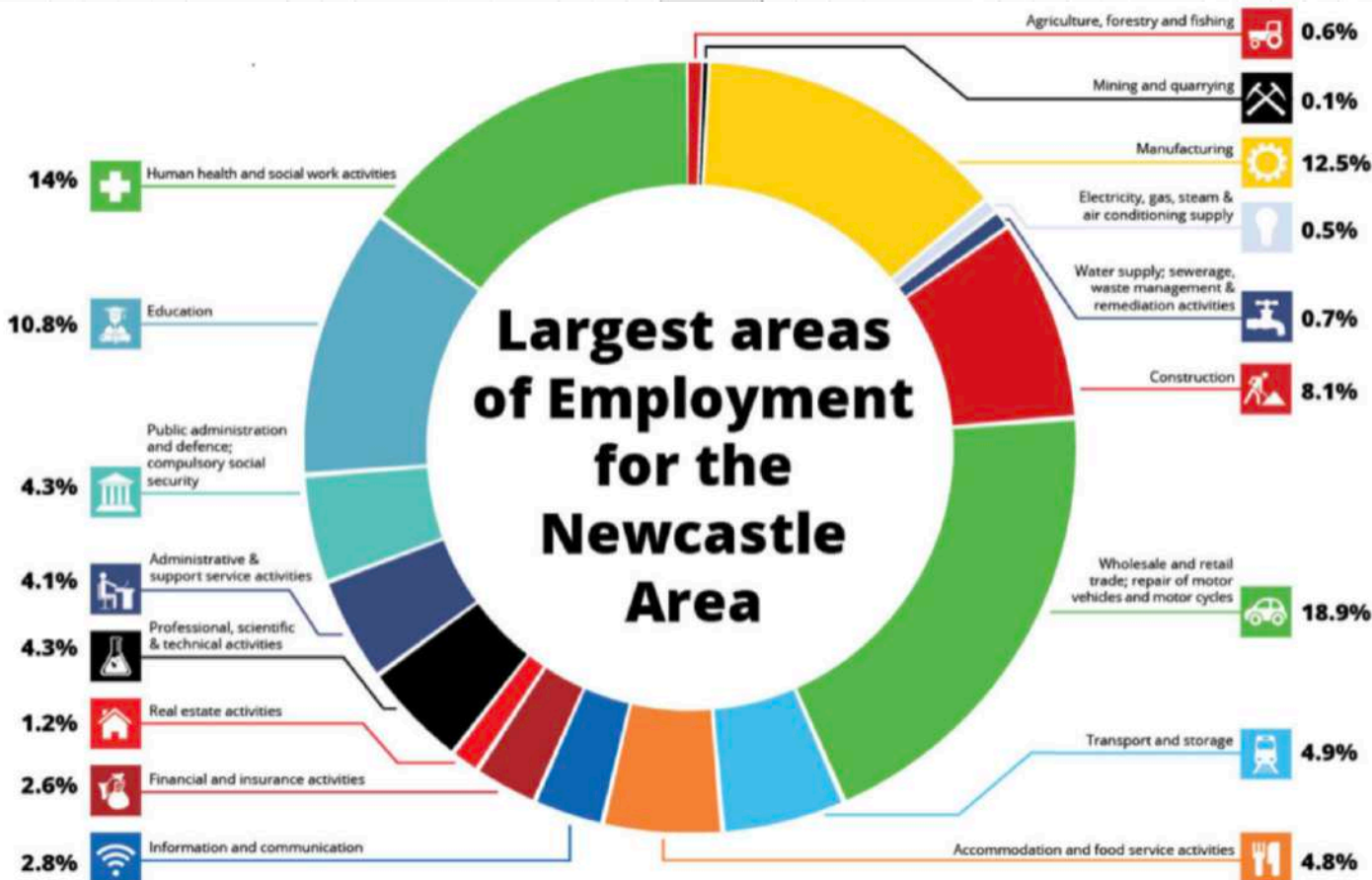

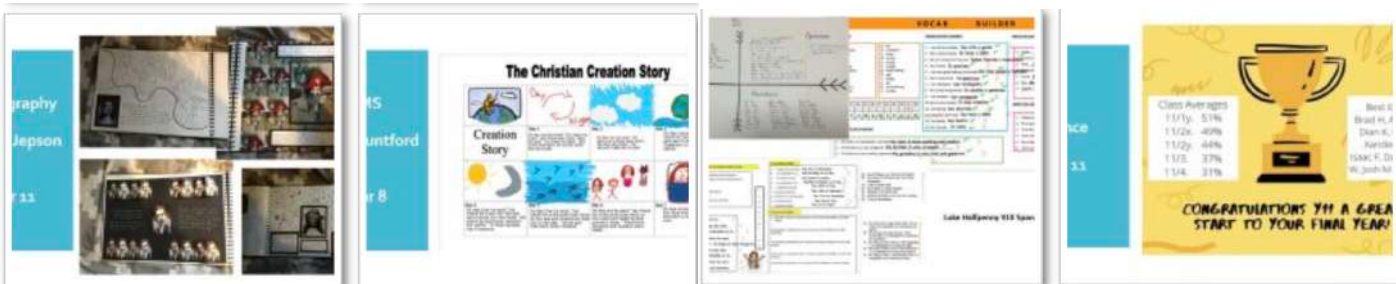

Every year on 1st November, vegans across the world celebrate and champion their vegan lifestyle. They believe that this way of living is beneficial not only to what it can do as far as your health goes but also in cultivating environmental protection while taking care of animals lives too!

Learning to deal with stress can take a lot of practise but it will worth it in the long-run. Here are some tips to help you out when stress is getting the better of you.

Recognise triggers:

if you are finding it difficult to cope, consider meeting with someone trained to help – this might include your GP or talking therapy.
