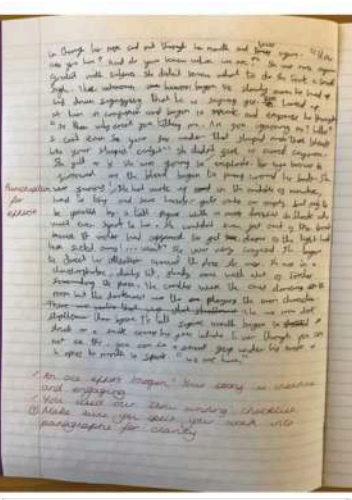
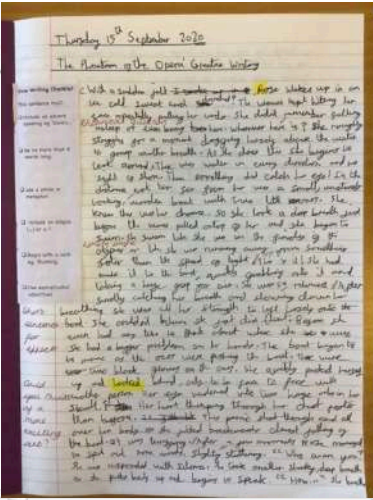

We would like to take this opportunity to extend our apologies for our school uniform policy. We expect high standards across all years in school and take great pride in the appearance of our pupils. First impressions are important and our school uniform is a key factor in this. Part of our school policy is to be prepared, and having the correct uniform and equipment will ensure that your child is better prepared for learning.

Our policy has been updated slightly to reflect the changes that our girls wear. This is to ensure that we have a level of consistency across all year groups. Girls will now be required to wear hairnets/scrunchies, we understand that many of our girls will not be able to wear hairnets and therefore we have updated the policy to allow for this. We are happy that many are not appropriate and will no longer be accepted as part of our school uniform. The following must be adhered to:

- Trainers must be a Halford, formal style
- They must not be light blue
- Ties, huggies, jump, joggings or trousers or ones that are classed as 'trendy', will no longer be allowed
- If the trousers have 'back pockets' then they are not a school uniform
- The style of the trousers must be based around the ankle
- Ankle should not be showing
- Trainers must be black or dark grey
- Black socks are preferred

If you have any doubts about the content you are ordering, please let us know and we will help. We will also have a stock of school uniform for those who are unable to purchase at home through our online shop. We do have the school staff which can be purchased at the school shop. This stock will be black socks or tights, will perfectly acceptable and it is a option growing to become popular without your child being necessary.

Any uniform of a very high standard. We have been asked by many if school shorts (with leggings) can be worn in the Summer months and this is acceptable. However, it is important to ensure that the shorts are black and girls should be wearing tights.

Details on how to order your uniform:

- For genuine reasons, please inform our school office (that same morning), phone call or email only, and no exceptions. They will then be issued a replacement and reported to the Head of Year and Mrs. Waterhouse, who will issue a code if applicable to the request.
- If you need more uniform than your current stock, please log in to the school website and place an order with Mrs. Waterhouse. A top will be sent home with the issue and then phone call for further issues. **There must be no cash on hand or cash on hand. Please do not bring cash to school. All orders must be placed online.**
- A weekly school uniform shop will be held at school where we have had no recent contact on the day of interest or when you have not been in school, with instructions after school on Friday. For those who are persistent, please bring them to be issued with a uniform is accepted.

Please see below for a summary

The uniform for the school includes:

- Black blazer with school badge. This should be worn at all times and can be taken off in boots (if a member of staff allows) in the summer, if the weather is too warm. Coats, jackets, hoodies and jumpers are not to be worn over school uniform.
- White shirt. It should be noted that this is a traditional shirt that buttons in the collar and is long enough to be tucked in. **It should be black or white.**
- A plain black jumper (the leggings can be worn under the blazer)
- School trousers
- Black trousers. Girls should note that the trousers must be of a formal, tailored style. **Not school uniform trousers.** We should be able to see an ankle (light tights, long trousers will be allowed at all. Black socks are preferred.)
- Girls: Girls are allowed to wear a school skirt with a school bag, which can be purchased from the school shop.
- Black formal low-heeled, no coloured tights, no additional colours on heels or soles. Footwear can be trainers as long as they are all black.
- Jewellery for safety and security reasons, only one pair of earring or stud earrings may be worn in each earlobe. Pupils may wear a watch.
- In all cases, jewellery should be removed if required for safety reasons (e.g. Technology)
- Hair should be of a natural colour - we are having an increase in coloured hair. Please ensure that our policy is adhered to. Pupils who do present themselves with a different colour hair (except grey) will have to wear hair as well will be monitored on a daily basis until it grows out.
- Earrings (except for natural pupils) will be asked to remove hair and
- Hair accessories and hair clips are not allowed (for health and safety reasons).
- An apron is required for Technology.

Girls:

- Black knee peak skirt, black smart/black sports leggings/black joggings bottoms (NOT any other colour) and black tights.
- There is also the option of having a black long-sleeved jersey and a black short-sleeved sports jacket.
- All clothes are available to buy.
- For outdoor field activities, boots, gum shoes and other shoes are necessary for rugby, hockey and football.
- Trainers with non-marking soles for outdoor use.

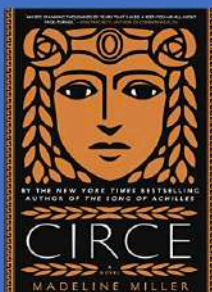
Queen Elizabeth ii (1926-2022)

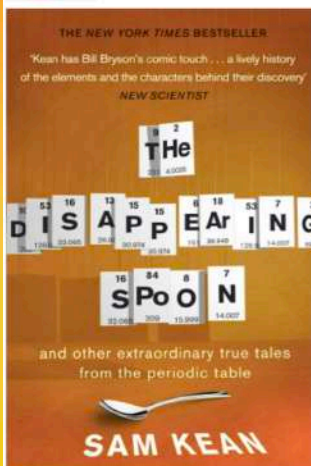

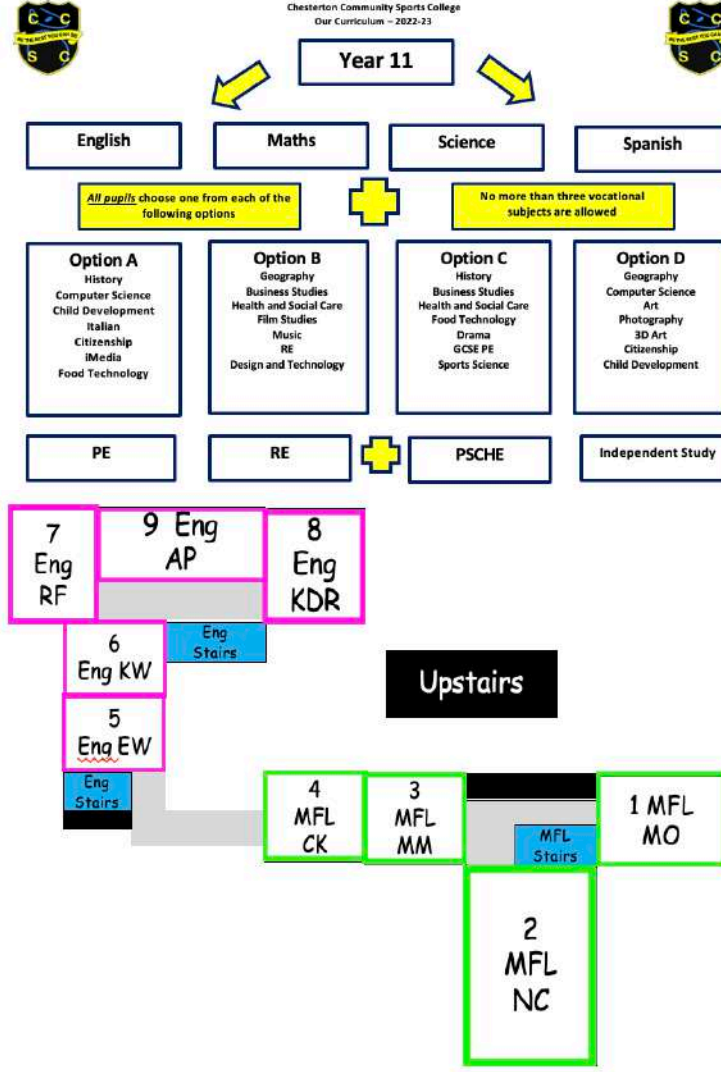
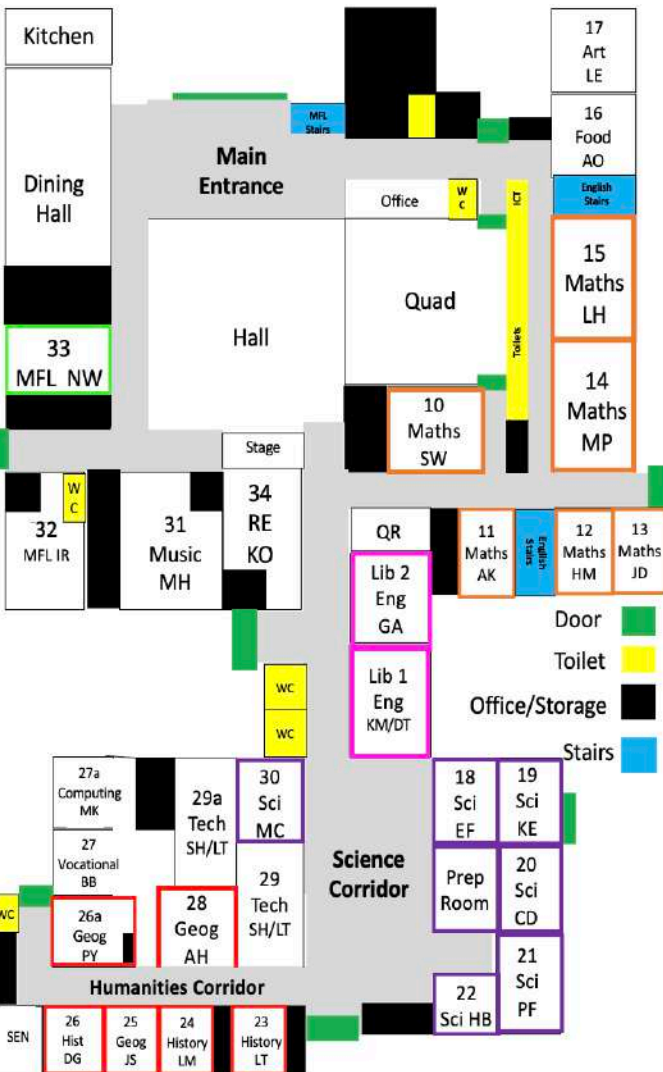

Tourism

Tourism is an industry that encourages people to travel for recreation and leisure. The growth of tourism has had an economic, environmental and social effect on many countries.

Types of Tourism

- **Beach holidays**, e.g. in Spain and the Maldives. People can relax on the beach or take part in water sports.
- **Outdoor adventure**, e.g. skiing and walking in the European Alps or the Rocky Mountains of North America.
- **Cultural/historic**, e.g. people like to visit historic sites, art galleries and museums in cities such as Rome and Paris. In cities like New York and London they can go shopping or see shows.
- **Ecotourism**, e.g. small numbers of people go trekking in the Amazon rainforest or on whale and dolphin conservation holidays in Scotland. This type of tourism is designed to be **sustainable**.

Positive Impacts	Negative Impacts
Jobs created	Jobs are often seasonal (based on the time of year) and are poorly paid
More money for the country visited	Most money goes out of the area to big companies, not locals
Local traditions and customs are kept alive because tourists enjoy traditional shows, e.g. Flamenco dancing	Culture and traditions change as outsiders arrive
Money from tourists can be used to protect the natural landscape	Damage to the natural environment, e.g. footpath erosion (the wearing away of footpaths), litter, habitats destroyed to build hotels
New facilities for the tourists also benefit locals, e.g. new roads	Overcrowding and traffic jams
Greater demand for local food and crafts	Prices increase in local shops as tourists are often wealthier than the local population
