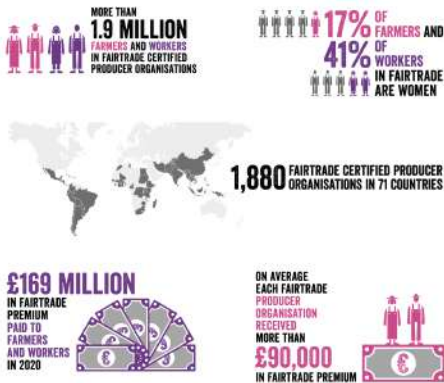


Fairtrade Fortnight: Monday 27th February

What is Fair Trade?

Fairtrade is a system of certification that began in 1992, aiming to ensure a set of standards are met in the production and supply of a product or ingredient, such as coffee or cocoa.

For farmers and workers, Fairtrade means workers' rights, safer working conditions and fairer pay. For shoppers it means high quality, ethically produced products.

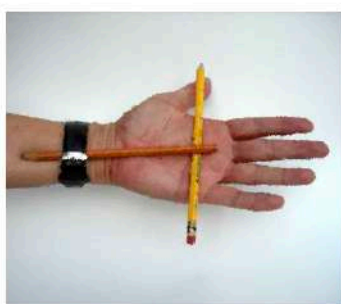
Magic trick of the week – try this!!!



10. The 'magnetic pencil' trick!

However, I am now very interested in being a **postman**, so when the mortgage is paid off we win the lotto, that's the DREAM.

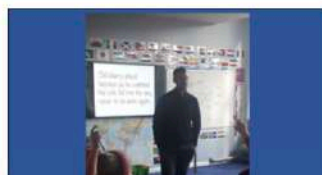

Women's History Month- March 2023.

Vera Brittain (b. 29.12.1893 - d. 29.03.1970)

Vera Mary Brittain was an English Voluntary Aid Detachment (VAD) nurse during World War 1 and later became a well-known writer, feminist, socialist and pacifist. Her best-selling 1933 memoir **Testament of Youth** recounted her experiences during the First World War and the beginning of her journey towards pacifism. **Born in Newcastle under Lyme**, Vera Brittain was the daughter of Thomas Arthur and Edith Mary Brittain. Her father was a director of family owned paper mills in Hanley and Cheddleton.

After overcoming her parents objections Vera entered Somerville College, Oxford to study English Literature. Finding her Oxford studies increasingly an irrelevance as her male contemporaries volunteered for war, she delayed her degree after one year in the summer of 1915 to work as a VAD nurse for much of the First World War. She served initially in Buxton, and later in London, Malta and in France where she was stationed close to the front at Etaples and where she nursed German prisoners of war, a significant staging post on her journey towards internationalism and onto pacifism.

She became a practical pacifist in the sense that during World War 2 she helped the war effort by working as a fire warden and by travelling around the country raising funds for the Peace Pledge Union's food relief campaign. She was vilified for speaking out against the saturation bombing of German cities. In 1945, the "Nazi's Black Book" of nearly 3,000 people to be immediately arrested in Britain after a German invasion was shown to include her name.

There is a blue plaque on Vera's former home in Sidmouth Avenue, Newcastle and she is the inspiration for a life-sized statue of a woman sitting on a bench, in the nearby Brampton Park.
