REVISE How To Revise/Recap

1. Summarise

Read a topic/chapter/page and summarise into 5 bullet points.

2. 5 Questions

Read the topic/chapter/page and write your own 5 questions with answers.

3. Definitions

Pick 5 keywords and write the meaning.

4. Picture

Draw a diagram/picture and label it to explain what it shows

5. Video

 Watch a SHORT video on YouTube on a topic/keyword/concept and pause it at appropriate times to make 5 bullet points.

6. Quiz

 Find 10 questions on kahoot, booklet or educake, answer them and make notes on anything you learn or need to remember.

7. Mind Map

Pick a topic and draw a mind map explaining 10 key points.

8. Copy

Pick a topic and read the crucial knowledge. Copy 5 sentences that you don't remember or understand.

9. Memory

Look at the crucial knowledge for 30 seconds. Cover it up and write down everything you can remember in 30 seconds. Repeat 3 times.

10. Flash Card

 Pick a topic/chapter/page and on the front of the flash card write 5 keywords/phrases or pictures and on the back write what they mean.

11. Exam Questions/Past Papers

 Pick a topic and answer exam questions. Ensure you use a mark scheme to check your answers. Past Papers can be found online and downloaded.

12. Worksheets/Workbooks

Pick a topic and complete a placemat or worksheet on that topic. Ask your teacher and they will print/send you lots. Use your memory first and then use other resources such as the crucial knowledge to help you.

PE FAQs

What PE kit is needed for PE lessons?

https://www.ccsc.staffs.sch.uk/index.php/pe-faqs

- Blue CCSC PE polo shirt
- Black shorts, leggings or joggers
- Trainers not their school trainers (this can be football boots if lessons are on the astro/field)
- • CCSC PE hoodie or a plain black/blue sports top (your child can check this by speaking to their PE teacher)
- ·Long hair tied up and jewellery removed/covered with a plaster (provided by home)

Swimming lessons:

- Towel
- ·Plain blue/black swimming costume or shorts Bermuda style shorts are not allowed
- If goggles are required then these need to be accompanied by a note from home granting permission for their use
- If excused, your child is to bring their PE kit to change into at the start of the lesson

NB: Your child is still expected to bring their PE kit to all PE lessons even when excused from PE.

My child cannot find part of their PE kit. Can they bring an alternative?

YES! If there is a genuine reason that your child cannot bring part of their CCSC PE kit, then we encourage pupils to bring a suitable alternative. No contact with the office is required, your child just needs to have a quick conversation with their PE teacher. However, if there is a long term reason for your child to not have the correct PE kit, then contact from home will be required. The correct PE kit is always the desired standard, therefore, acquiring a replacement PE item is desirable. The PE department can also provide clean spare kit.







What is a Psychologist?

Psychologist's are trained to apply their knowledge in ways to help people with a range of personal difficulties. These difficulties are often problems that are causing someone distress or how someone is thinking, feeling and learning. Psychologist's have a better understanding of their difficulties by exploring ways to make positive changes to their lives and their aim is to reduce distress by promoting psychological well-being.

What qualifications do you need?

To become a psychologist you do not need all three sciences at A level, however most universities prefer at least one A level in chemistry, biology, physics or maths. Therefore, a combination of decent academic A level subjects is required and a psychology A level is beneficial but is not normally needed. To become a full-time psychologist, completing an undergraduate degree in psychology is essential for this profession and these take around three years to complete. Gaining an aspect of work experience in the

responsibility as a psychology intern or assistant can increase your chances of getting offered a job after graduating and completing one internship while your still as university is helpful.

What Career Pathways can you take?

With a degree in psychology you can take career pathways in arts or scientific fields, depending on what your personal preference is. Scientific fields refer to getting involved in clinical applied work such as: hospital, elderly homes, mental health care clinics, social work or education. Career paths that combine psychology with art include: art therapy, graphic design for mental health organisations and working as a designer for educational purposes.

New Trick Every Week!

Magic trick of the week - try this!!!

17. Guess the card

You will need: A pack or 'deck' of playing cards.

How to do the trick:

1: Shuffle the deck of playing cards.

2: Count out 21 cards from the deck.

3: Shuffle these 21 cards.

4: Fan the cards out in your hand with the pictures face down. Ask a member of the audience to choose a card, memorise it and place it back with the other cards without you seeing it. Reshuffle the cards.

5: Next, ask the volunteer to watch carefully. Start dealing the cards into three piles, facing upwards. Once they are dealt into three piles, ask the volunteer to point to the pile that contains their card.

6: Pick up the three piles of cards, making sure you always sandwich the pile with the volunteer's card between the other two piles. (Don't shuffle the cards.)

7: Repeat steps 5 and 6 two more times.

8: Now for the magic part. Say the magic word *ah haaa* over the cards and deal them out. Count very carefully in your head as you do this. When you get to the eleventh card, announce to the audience that this is the volunteer's card.

Commonly, In the Western World, there is a statue (Lady Justice) on the top of important court buildings, based on an ancient Roman goddess.

The scales symbolise the weighing of evidence and arguments put forward in a court of law. The sword represents the power and authority of the court to enforce the law and protect society. The blindfold is symbol of impartiality (not taking sides) and fairness.

Justice is one of mankinds most important moral and political concepts. The word comes from the Latin *jus*, meaning right or law. Over 300 years before the birth of Jesus, the Greek Philosopher and Polymath, Aristotle wrote that justice consists in what is lawful and fair, with fairness involving equitable (impartial) distributions and the correction of what is inequitable (unfair or partial).

Our concept of what Justice is affects our behaviour and attitudes in nearly every aspect of our daily lives, it is reflected in our own personal standards and the way that we treat others. It is not just a matter of individual compliance with the law. Society relies on this in that all laws rely principally on voluntary compliance.

The Law is a system of rules and regulations established by the government to maintain social order and protect citizens' rights, while justice is the principle of fairness and the treatment of people based on rights, and equality. While the law is not always able to achieve justice in every case and satisfy all of the parties that might be involved it is an important tool for promoting justice and ensuring that individuals are held accountable for their actions. It can occasionally be wrong and includes procedures to try and prevent this.

The wider meaning of the word justice is reflected in some everyday sayings, such as:

Bring someone to justice	To arrest someone for a crime and ensure that they are brought to court. What happens afterwards is a matter for the court.
Do yourself justice	To act/perform as well as you are able to. (Be the best you can be).
Do someone else or something justice	To do, treat or represent someone or something with the fairness or appreciation that it is due. (To respect the rights of other people and property which does not belong to you).


