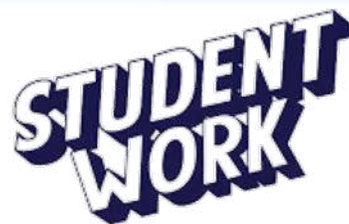

Comienza el mayor espectáculo del fútbol femenino

¿Hay por fin igualdad en el deporte? La Copa Mundial Femenina comenzó el jueves con la predicción de que será la “más grande y mejor” de la historia. Ya era hora, dicen algunos.

“Este organismo ha decretado que el fútbol femenino no es recomendable. Un juego ‘no apto para mujeres’”.

Así respondió un periódico a la decisión de la FA de **prohibir** que las mujeres jueguen en sus campos en 1921.

Poco más de un siglo después, el fútbol femenino ha vuelto. La Copa Mundial Femenina de 2023 **está llamada a ser** la más grande de la historia, **rivalizando** con la popularidad del torneo masculino.

Se espera que la audiencia supere los 2.000 millones de espectadores, la mayor de la historia en el deporte femenino.

Pero **llama la atención** la diferencia de popularidad entre los deportes masculinos y femeninos. Los deportes femeninos atraen menos público, menos financiación, menos oportunidades y elogios.

Algunos dicen que las limitaciones físicas hacen que los deportes sean menos interesantes cuando los practican mujeres; otros dicen que simplemente no hay forma de hacerlos económicamente exitosos. Para otros, ambas “razones” son **pura misoginia**.

Abandonando hábitos

Sí: los deportes femeninos **están causando sensación**, atrayendo multitudes y permitiendo a las atletas reclamar los **premios** que se les deben.

No: Claramente todavía hay un largo camino por recorrer. No es solo un problema de salarios y oportunidades, sino también de actitudes sociales que están profundamente **arraigadas**.

O... Mientras los deportes masculinos atraigan a más espectadores, los deportistas masculinos serán más rentables. No es necesariamente un signo de desigualdad que las mujeres aún ganen menos, solo una respuesta económica a las condiciones sociales.

Después de todo, hubo un tiempo en el que el fútbol femenino era incluso más popular que el masculino. Durante la Primera Guerra Mundial, las trabajadoras de las fábricas crearon equipos de fútbol en las fábricas y su popularidad **se disparó**.

En 1920 un histórico partido de fútbol femenino atrajo a casi 70.000 espectadores. Este nivel de asistencia **no se igualaría** en 92 años.

Poco después, el fútbol femenino fue víctima de su propio éxito. En 1921, temerosa de que los equipos femeninos fueran más populares que los masculinos, la FA prohibió el fútbol femenino. La prohibición **estaría vigente** durante 51 años.

Recientemente, las cosas están mejorando para el deporte femenino. La **brecha salarial de género** se ha reducido, y cada año más personas **siguen** los torneos femeninos.

Para algunos el **listón** está demasiado bajo. Se espera que en el Mundial de 2023 las mujeres ganen solo 25 céntimos por cada dólar que ganaron los hombres en el Mundial del año pasado. Y ganarán más de 250 millones de libras menos que los hombres en la Copa del Mundo de 2022.

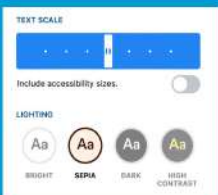
What is Sora?

Poverty

Global poverty is defined as the number of people worldwide who live on less than 2:15 US dollars (£1.64) a day. The World Bank defines this as **extreme poverty**.

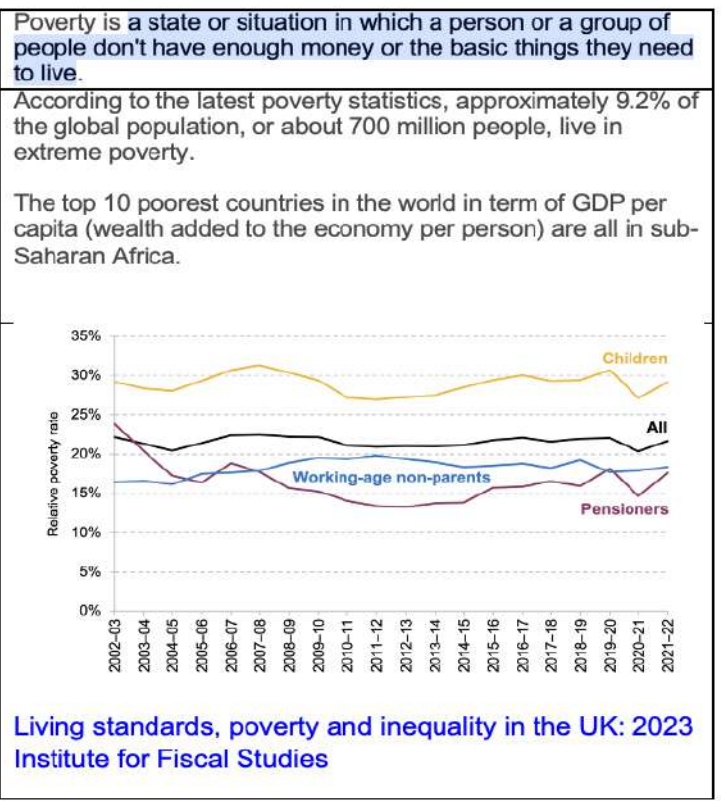
It is estimated that worldwide each day, 25,000 people, including more than 10,000 children die from hunger and related causes. Approximately 10% of the World's population are thought to be undernourished.

Definitions of Poverty vary widely around the world. The UK definition is broadly the same as used in the rest of Europe but is hugely different to the United Nations standard for extreme poverty.

The UK poverty line - Households are considered to be below this line if their income is below 60% of the median household income (in 2023 this equated to £20,700) after housing costs for that year.

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data shows that around one in six people in the UK were in relative low income (relative poverty) before housing costs in 2022/23. This rises to just over one in five people once housing costs are accounted for.

The UK Department of Work and Pensions has recently consulted on a new Poverty Measure known as Below Average Resources (BAR) which together with statistics based on Households Below Average Income (HBAI) will seek to help address, in particular, material deprivation in children.
