Dear Parent/Carer

8th July 2025

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our school uniform policy. We expect high standards across all years in school and take great pride in the appearance of our pupils. First impressions are important and our school uniform is to be worn with pride. Part of our school values is to 'be prepared' and having the correct uniform and equipment will ensure that your child is effectively prepared for learning.

Here is an update regarding our sanctions:

- For genuine reasons, please inform our school office (that same morning) - phone calls or emails only and no letters/notes. They will then be issued a uniform card and reported to the Head of Year, Mrs. Moscati (Assistant Headteacher) and Mr. Salt (Head of Key Stage), who will then decide if isolation is still required.
- If no valid reason is given that morning, a conduct log will be issued and form teachers will report to Mrs. Moscati and Mr. Salt. **These pupils will be isolated with either form tutor, Head of Year, Key Stage Leader or even placed in the Quiet Room.**
- A weekly whole-school detention will then be issued where we have had no parent contact on the day of incorrect uniform (parent text will be sent on Monday morning, with detentions after school on Tuesdays). This will be for any pupil who has received a conduct log for incorrect uniform. For those who are persistent, Quiet Room time will be issued until uniform is corrected. Failure to attend this detention will result in further detentions, quiet room time or a referral to the SLT detention.

Please see below for a summary of acceptable uniform:

The uniform for the school includes:

- Black blazer with school badge. This should be worn at all times and can be taken off in lessons **only** if a member of staff allows it (for example, in hot weather).
- Coats, jackets, hoodies and jumpers are not to be worn around school.
- White shirt: It should be noted that this is a traditional shirt that buttons to the collar and is long enough to be tucked in (**skirts should be tucked in at all times**).
- A plain, black jumper (no logos) can be worn under the blazer. The school tie must still be visible.
- School house tie.
- Black trousers: Girls should note that the trousers must be of a formal, tailored style, i.e. **not fitted trousers, jeans or leggings**. We should not be able to see ankles! Tight fitting or trousers in a lycra material will not be allowed at all. Black socks are preferred.
- Skirts: Girls are allowed to wear a school skirt with a school logo, which can be purchased from the school shop. Skirts should be of appropriate length and not rolled over at the top. Black tights or black socks/knee high socks required.
- Black footwear (low-heel, no coloured logos, no additional colours on laces or soles). Footwear can be trainers as long as they are all black.
- Jewellery: For safety and security reasons, only one pair of sleeper or stud earrings may be worn in each earlobe. Nose studs or any other facial piercing are not permitted.

- Pupils may wear a watch.
- In all cases, jewellery should be removed for safety reasons (PE, Technology). Where jewellery can't be removed or where it goes against the school policy (in the case of facial piercings), pupils will be made to wear plasters to cover until it can be removed.
- Hair should be of a natural colour – we are having an increase in coloured hair. Please ensure that our policy is adhered to. Pupils who do present themselves with a different colour hair (and go against policy) will have to wear hair up and will be monitored on a daily basis until it grows out.
- Eyelashes: need to be natural (pupils will be asked to remove fake ones).
- Nail varnish and false nails are not allowed (for health and safety reasons).
- An apron is required for Technology.
- Air pods/wireless earphones are not allowed in lessons. Pupils will be asked that these are removed and, in some cases, will be confiscated.
- Using mobile phones in school is not permitted.

Summer Uniform



- In the Summer term, pupils are allowed to wear our 'summer uniform'. We will notify parents and pupils as to when this choice will begin.
- Shorts are allowed but must be tailored and at knee length (short version of a tailored school trouser). These shorts have to be black and not sports, joggers or any other style.
- Tie and blazer to still be worn but will be allowed to remove in extreme temperatures and at the teacher's discretion.

PE KIT

- Royal blue polo shirt, black shorts/black sports leggings/black jogging bottoms (NOT any other colour) and black socks.
- PE Hoodies are available to buy.
- For outdoor field activities, boots, gum shield and shin pads are necessary for rugby, hockey and football.
- Trainers with non-marking soles for indoor use.
- Nike pro shorts are NOT allowed. Sport shorts must come to at least mid-thigh/just above the knee.
- Please read the PE FAQs and department policy for further information on if your child is unable to take part in PE lessons.

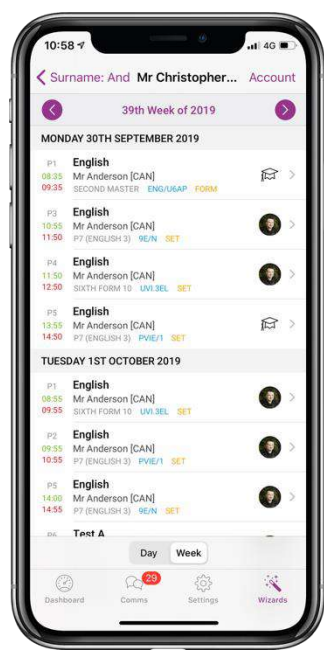

A Glaswegian teenager called Rebecca Young is one of 10 girls from across the world featured on the cover of TIME magazine. Rebecca is an inventor who came up with a solar-powered blanket for the homeless. She has also been honoured with a LEGO® figure of herself!

For over a century TIME magazine has devoted its front page to the most famous people on the planet. Now Rebecca from Kelvinside Academy has joined them!

Prize idea

When she was 12, Rebecca entered the Primary **Engineer** competition. She was up against over 70,000 others. All had to come up with an idea for tackling a **social** problem – and Rebecca's took first prize.

Helping the homeless

The idea for a blanket

came to her at a school engineering club. "Seeing all the homeless people, it made me want to help," she says. "It's a problem that should be fixed."

The story caught the eye of a TIME magazine editor. Rebecca was chosen as one of its 10 "girls of the year". The others include Zoé Clauzure, a French anti-bullying campaigner, and Ivanna Richards, a Mexican racing driver. Peace

The word 'peace' can have several related meanings. If something is peaceful, it would be considered a tranquil freedom from disturbance. In a societal sense, peace is a period of time when there is no conflict, or conflict has ended. The absence of war is therefore known as peacetime.

The Nobel Peace Prize

The Nobel Peace Prize is one of 5 prizes set up in the will of renowned Swedish Chemist and Inventor Alfred Nobel. Nobel, decided it should be awarded to the person who in the previous year "shall have done the most or the best work for fraternity between nations, for the abolition or reduction of standing armies and for the holding and promotion of peace congresses."

Notable Peace Prize Winners

- Martin Luther King Jr. (1964)- civil rights activist awarded "for his non-violent struggle for civil rights for the Afro-American population."
- Willy Brandt (1973)- chancellor of West Germany from 1969-1974, "for paving the way for a meaningful dialogue between East and West" during the Cold War.
- Mikhail Gorbachev (1990)- final President of the Soviet Union, "for the leading role he played in the radical changes in East-West relations."
- Nelson Mandela (1993), "for his work for the peaceful termination of the apartheid regime, and for laying the foundations for a new democratic South Africa."
- Barack Obama (2009)- 44th President of the USA, "for his extraordinary efforts to strengthen international diplomacy and cooperation between peoples."



Nobel Peace Prize Winners: Martin Luther King, Willy Brandt, Mikail Gorbachev, Nelson Mandela & Barack Obama

Did you know?

- Along with the Nobel Prizes, Alfred Nobel is most notable as the inventor of dynamite. His inclusion of 'peace' as a Nobel Prize category is thought to be his attempt to reconcile the use of his invention in war and destruction.
