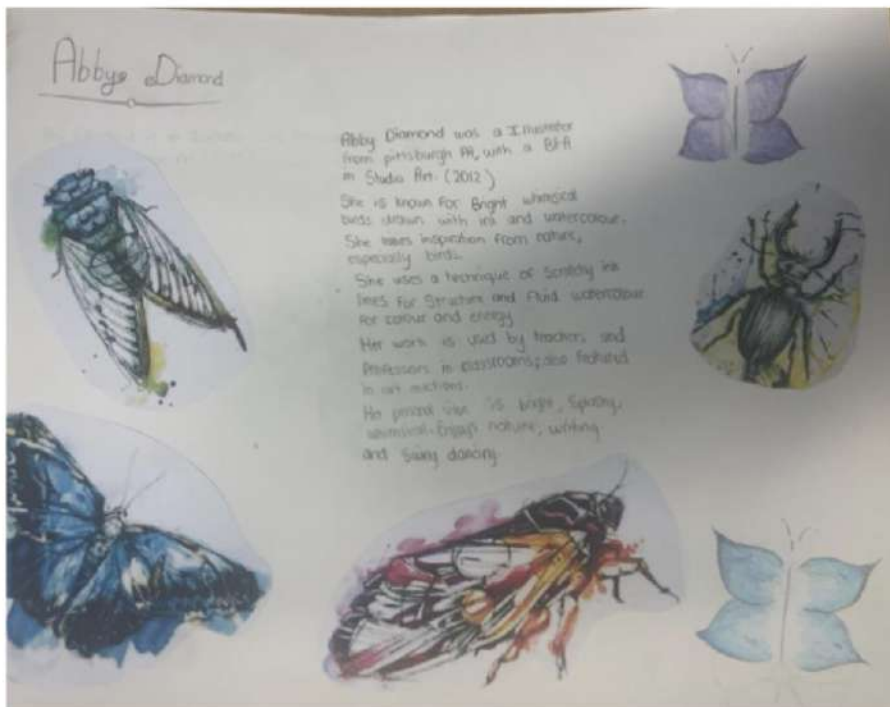

cBay at CCSC



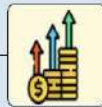
What is it?

¿Podemos adaptarnos a las olas de calor? Los británicos se enfrentan a días de calor. Mientras algunos disfrutan del sol, otros temen que el país sufra con el aumento de las temperaturas.

Refrescándose: el día más caluroso en el Reino Unido se registró el 19 de julio de 2022, cuando las temperaturas alcanzaron los 40,3 °C en Coningsby, Lincolnshire.

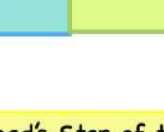

Information

The word 'information' means to something that has the power to inform. It concerns any natural, non-random process that can be sensed and interpreted. Methods of conveying information therefore include written language, images, sounds and music amongst others.

Information is often processed in steps. Think of a sentence. First, the eyes interpret the individual letters, the brain then interprets the combination of letters into words, before the words are mentally put together to interpret the meaning of the sentence.

In digital information, initial information is converted to a digital version in the form of bits, which can subsequently be transmitted and interpreted elsewhere.

A Brief History of Information

- **Verbal**- In early history, most information was passed verbally from generation to generation.
- **Written records**- invention of written language allowed hand-written records to be kept
- **Printing**- invented in 1440, the Gutenberg press allowed texts to be produced much more quickly and inexpensively, improving access to reading.
- **Telegraph**- developed in the 1850s, the telegraph allowed long-distance messages using electronic cables.
- **Telephones**- 1876, allowed voice calls to be transmitted in a similar way to the telegraph
- **Radio**- early 20th century, utilised electromagnetic waves to transmit audio wirelessly
- **Television**- 1940s- extended the previous technology to moving pictures and film
- **Microprocessors & Computers**- 1970s/80s- allowed for storage and access of digital information in large volumes

- **Internet & World Wide Web**- first used by DARPA in the 70s and expanded to create the World Wide Web in the 90s allowed the global sharing of information across a vast network in the form of websites
- **Rise of AI**- modern AI systems can understand, process, and generate human-like language, enabling them to perform a variety of tasks utilising large amounts of information.
