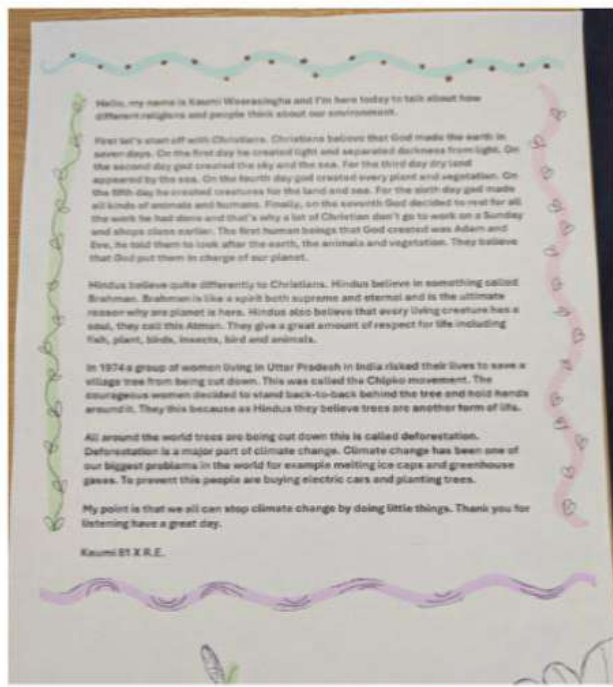

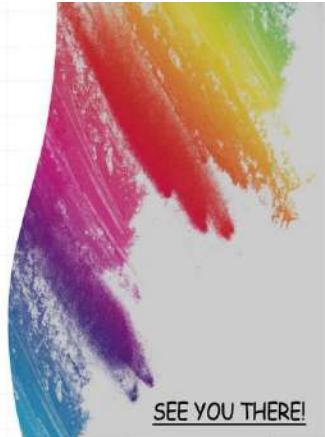

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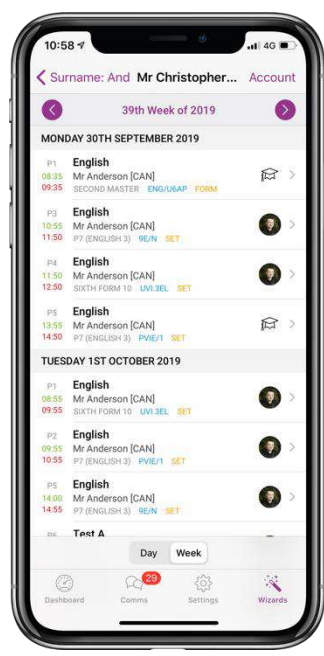

The small town that banned modern technology



Would a tech-free life be better? The radio silence around the Green Bank telescope is attracting “wi-fi refugees”. But experts say it is almost impossible to completely log off.

Mercy meeting: *United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said he would be willing to meet with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and US President Donald Trump at the United Nations General Assembly next week to discuss the situation in Gaza.*

In the hills of **West Virginia**, a giant white ear listens in on deep space. This is the world’s largest radio telescope. It scans the skies for aliens and **asteroids**. And it needs perfect silence. Green Bank is in the US National Radio Quiet Zone, where the internet, mobile phones and microwaves are banned.

And in the last decade, people have moved here because they believe technology is making them sick. They call it electromagnetic hypersensitivity (EHS), although the **WHO** says it has “no scientific basis”

You do not have to believe in EHS to be wary of technology. Since the pandemic, internet use has skyrocketed. People are trying to detox: switch off devices for a day, a week, or longer. “I want my life back,” wrote Mark Boyle in 2016. He decided to live entirely tech-free. “It’s a choice,” he writes, “between the machine world and the living world” and he feels “healthier” for giving up technology. But in a world with more phones than people, it may be too late. 3 Experts say we depend on devices for everything. We work, shop, learn, play and connect through our screens. The solution is “mindfulness”, says digital expert Sina Joneidy. Quit scrolling and focus on using technology with purpose. The goal is to regain control without losing the benefits.

If you hate technology you might be called a Luddite. These were 19th Century textile workers who destroyed weaving machines to protest against working conditions. But expert Jathan Sadowski says he’s a “proud” Luddite, and “you should be too.” Those factory workers were not stupid or against progress. “No technology is **sacred**”, argues Sadowski, and we should reject tech that makes our lives worse. And with the rise of AI, now may be our last opportunity to ask the question.

Would a tech-free life be better? Bad signal

Yes: We need to reconnect with ourselves, each other and the world around us. Technology is distracting and ruins our concentration.

No: From medicine to communication and entertainment, technology makes our lives easier, faster and safer. Be mindful of how you use it, but a tech-free world would be a disaster.

Or... It all depends on what we mean by technology. Everything from a spoon to a supercomputer is a type of tech, a tool to help us do stuff. We need the right questions to separate the good from the bad.

Free

For something to be 'free,' it is fully able to change and is not constrained in its present state. When applied to people, a person can be described as free when they are fully able and empowered to make decisions in all aspects of life. That can be manifested in freedom of speech, expression, political freedom, religious freedom and freedom from want or fear.

The words 'liberty' and 'freedom' are often used interchangeably but it can be argued that if a person were to act in a truly free manner, then they would not have to obey the law of the land. The concept of liberty therefore allows responsible freedom under the rule of the law, in other words, that a person can be free to make their own life choices and decisions so long as they are law-abiding. This extends to those in political power, who must also operate within the law.

How free are we in the UK?

1. **Political Freedom**- citizens of the UK have the right to vote, form political parties and to protest. The rule of law ensures governments must operate legally and the people therefore have their rights protected. There is also a free press where governments can be openly criticised.
2. **Civil Liberties**- freedom of speech and expression is protected in the UK, with a few exceptions such as hate speech. The right to protest is protected although the increasingly policed nature of such events has been criticised. Critics also argue that the UK's extensive surveillance laws weaken rights to privacy. Religious freedom in the UK is protected.
3. **Economic Freedom**- the UK's economy is largely open with moderate government regulation. Private property is secure. It has been argued that rising financial inequality and rising housing costs have somewhat diminished economic freedom for all in recent years and decades.

4. **Social Freedoms**- the UK has strong protection for gender equality and LGBT rights. Discrimination laws are robust although do not fully eliminate discrimination in practice. Access to free healthcare and education in the UK ensures a baseline of social rights and opportunity regardless of socioeconomic status.

In summary, despite some criticisms, the UK can very much be classed as 'free' although many commentators note erosions of civil liberties in recent years, and the need for ongoing debate on these issues.
