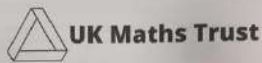

CCSC UNIFORM POLICY



Blazers

- Black blazer with school badge must be worn.
- All other items - coats, jackets, hoodies must be worn over your school blazer.
- Blazer can be removed in lessons - with teacher permission.

Jumpers

- Plain black jumper (no logos) may be worn under your school blazer.

Trousers

- Black, formal tailored trousers to be worn.
- The following are not allowed: Leggings, fitted trousers, Lycra style or any trousers that do not cover the ankle.
- Black socks preferred to be worn.

Skirts

- School skirt with logo (from school shop).
- Appropriate length and not rolled up at the waist.
- Worn with black tights or black socks. No other coloured socks allowed

Hair, Nails, Make up and Jewellery:

- Hair must be of a natural colour
- Pupils with dyed hair must have it tied up and it will be monitored until it grows out.
- No false nails or nail varnish.
- No false eyelashes or lash extensions.
- Watches allowed - no rings or bracelets
 - One set of studs or small hoops permitted.
- Nose studs not allowed.

Devices and Equipment:

- Apron required for Technology.
- AirPods / earphones are not allowed in lessons (may be confiscated).
- Mobile phones must not be used in school.

Shirt and Tie

- White traditional shirt with buttons done to the collar.
 - Must be tucked in.
- School tie worn properly and visible.

Sustainability

The word sustainability comes from the Latin *sustinere*, meaning to 'hold up or hold upright.' The concept of sustainability refers to a state in which the environment, economy and society will continue to exist over a long period of time. In simple terms, it is about using what we need today without messing things up for people in the future. The term was first coined by Hans Carl von Carlowitz in the 18th Century, in Saxony (modern day Germany) who, when discussing the timber industry, proposed the "conservation and replanting of timber that there can be a continuous, ongoing and sustainable use."

Sustainability and Sustainable Development

If 'sustainability' can be thought of as a long-term goal, the related term 'sustainable development' can be considered as the many processes and pathways by which this goal can be achieved. Sustainable development is therefore an approach to human development that aims to not only meet the needs of the present population, but also ensures future generations will have the ability to meet their own needs. The aim is to have a society where living conditions and resources meet human needs without undermining the integrity of the planet. To this end, sustainable development aims to balance the needs of the environment, economy and society (known as the 'three pillars of sustainability.'). In 2015, all UN nations adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, creating 17 World Sustainable Development Goals.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



The 3 Pillars of Sustainability

- 1. Environmental Sustainability:** involves ideas such as using renewable energy resources, reducing pollution, recycling, reducing single use plastics and protecting forests. A real world example might be an energy company increasing investment in wind or solar power.
- 2. Social Sustainability:** fair wages to all staff, safe working conditions, access to education and healthcare for all. Real world examples may include the building of affordable housing, promoting fair-trade goods and making education available to all.
- 3. Economic Sustainability-** investing in long-term planning, not just short-term profit, providing stable jobs and businesses. An example would be investing in green tech which will provide job opportunities for many generations to come.
