### Parents' Guide to Booking Appointments

Click on the <https://ccsc.schoolcloud.co.uk>



**Step 1: Login**  
Fill out the details on the page then click the Log In button. A confirmation of your appointments will be sent to the email address you provide.



**Step 2: Select Parents' Evening**  
Click on the date you wish to book.  
Unselect to remove all of the dates listed. Click the unselect to attend.



**Step 3: Select Booking Mode**  
Choose Automatic if you'd like the system to suggest the shortest possible appointment duration based on the times you're available to attend. To pick the time to book with each teacher, choose Manual. Then click Next.  
**We recommend choosing the automatic booking mode when booking as a single parent.**



**Step 4: Select Availability**  
Drag the sliders at the top of the screen to indicate the earliest and latest you can attend.



**Step 5: Choose Teachers**  
Select the teachers you'd like to book appointments with. A green tick indicates they're selected. To deselect, click on their name.



**Step 6: Book Appointments (Automatic)**  
If you chose the automatic booking mode, you'll see pre-proposed appointments which are held for 2 minutes. To keep them, choose Accept at the bottom left. If you aren't possible to book every selected teacher during that time, you can select attend, you can either adjust the teachers you wish to meet with and try again, or switch to manual booking mode.



World Malaria Day 2022 will be marked under the theme **“Harness innovation to reduce the malaria disease burden and save lives.”** No single tool that is available today will solve the problem of malaria. WHO is calling for investments and innovation that bring new vector control approaches, diagnostics, antimalarial medicines and other tools to speed the pace of progress against malaria.

Malaria is a preventable and treatable disease that continues to have a devastating impact on the health and livelihood of people around the world. In 2020, there were an estimated 241 million new cases of malaria and 627 000 malaria-related deaths in 85 countries. More than two thirds of deaths were among children under the age of 5 living in the WHO African Region.

Despite steady advances in lowering the global burden of malaria between 2000 and 2015, progress has slowed or stalled in recent years, particularly in high burden countries in sub-Saharan Africa. Urgent and concerted action is needed to set the world back on a trajectory toward achieving the 2030 targets of the WHO global malaria strategy.

- 1) Malaria is caused by a protist (parasite).
- 2) Part of the malarial protist's life cycle takes place inside the mosquito. The mosquitoes are vectors.
- 3) Every time the mosquito feeds on another animal, it infects it by inserting the protist into the animals blood vessels.
- 4) Malaria causes repeating episodes of fever. It can be fatal.
- 5) The spread of malaria can be reduced by stopping the mosquitoes from breeding.
- 6) People can be protected from mosquitoes using insecticides and mosquito nets.

Malaria is taught in Science in Biology Paper 1. The crucial knowledge is that malaria is a communicable disease and is caused by the pathogen protist.
