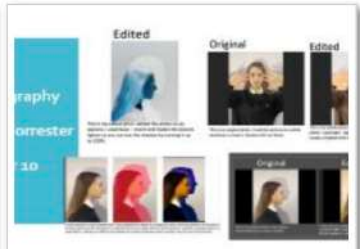

How Does Reading Help Mental Health?

- Studies have shown that reading as little as **6 minutes per day** can improve your quality of sleep, reduce stress, and sharpen mental acuity.
- Reading strengthens the neural circuits and pathways of our brain while lowering heart rate and blood pressure.
- Reading gives me the opportunity to slow down and be present within the story, a welcome escape from moments of anxious overthinking.

The Reading Agency: Reading Well

Reading Well for young people recommends expert endorsed books about mental health, providing 13 to 18 year olds with advice and information about issues like anxiety, stress and OCD, and difficult experiences like bullying and exams.

The books have all been recommended by young people and health professionals, and are available to borrow for free from public libraries.

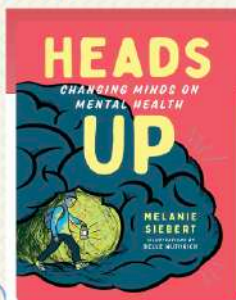

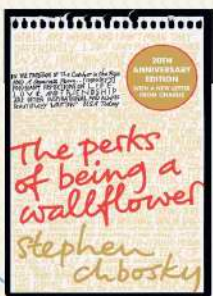


What Books are Available on Sora?



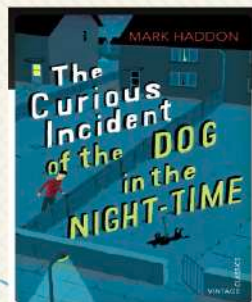

Medieval Newcastle-under-Lyme

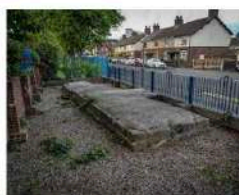


The medieval period is generally accepted as the time **between 1066 (Norman conquest of Saxon England) and 1485 (when the outcome of the Battle of Bosworth established the Tudor dynasty).**

In early Norman times Newcastle did not exist as a settlement and is not mentioned in the 1086 Domesday Book. The area was part of the Lyme Forrest. The later settlement grew up rapidly around a 12th-century castle. It was built as a motte and bailey castle, within a large pool of water that was fed from the Lyme Brook and other streams. A motte and bailey castle is a type of castle that sits upon a raised area of land called a motte, topped by a building called a keep which is then surrounded by a walled courtyard called a bailey. This was all surrounded by a protective ditch or moat.



The castle also had a bridge over the moat, which was originally made of wood, but later was rebuilt out of stone. During the 13th century, the wooden buildings were replaced with stone and stables, a garrison, a chapel and a storehouse were all added and a lot of repairs and strengthening work was done to the castle's defences.



King Henry III granted the castle and the manor of Newcastle to his younger son Edmund, who became the Earl of Lancaster, in 1267. When Henry IV became King in 1399 the castle was no longer used as a royal stronghold. It was in a low-lying area and surrounded by higher ground which made it more vulnerable as siege warfare had advanced, although the castle was still being repaired and refurbished throughout the 15th century.

Unfortunately, the only remaining visible parts of the castle are the overgrown motte and the preserved castle wall. **The remaining parts of the castle and motte can be found at the end of John O'Gaunt's Road and in the park on Silverdale Road.**

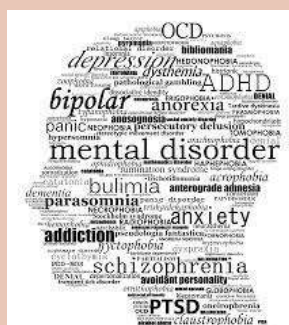
- **central nervous system**.
