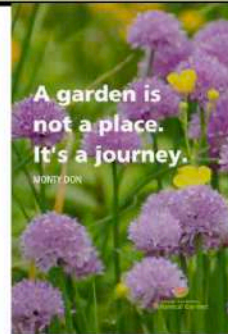
GARDEN CLUB

Space launches in history during the month of June

The US military, the US Federal Aviation Administration and NASA define the edge of space as above 80 km off the ground, towards the upper part of the Mesosphere. The Kármán line is an attempt to define a boundary between Earth's atmosphere and outer space, and offers a specific definition set by the FAI, an international record-keeping body for aeronautics setting the distance at 100 km. As of the launch of Shenzhou 14, on 5 June 2022, there have been 363 human spaceflight launches carrying many more than that number of individual astronauts. Amongst the manned and unmanned launches into space during the month of June were;

Pioneer 10	Pioneer 10 is an American space probe, launched on 14 June 1972 and weighing 258 kilograms, that completed the first mission to the planet Jupiter. Thereafter, Pioneer 10 became the first of five artificial objects to achieve the escape velocity needed to leave the Solar System.
Mariner 5	Mariner 5 was a spacecraft of the American Mariner program launched on 15 June 1967. It successfully carried out a complement of experiments to probe Venus' atmosphere and sample the solar particles and magnetic field fluctuations above the planet.
Shenzhou 12	Shenzhou is a spacecraft developed and operated by China to support its crewed spaceflight program. Its design resembles the Russian Soyuz spacecraft, but it is larger in size. On 16 June 2021 three Chinese astronauts were launched into space to complete further commissioning work on the Chinese space station.
Shuttle STS-51-G	STS-51-G was the 18th flight of NASA's Space Shuttle program, and the fifth flight of Space Shuttle Discovery. The seven-day mission launched from Kennedy Space Centre, Florida, on 17 June 1985, and landed at Edwards Air Force Base, California, on 24 June 1985.
STS 7	STS-7 was NASA's seventh Space Shuttle mission and the second mission for the Space Shuttle Challenger. During the mission Challenger deployed several satellites into orbit. The shuttle launched from the Kennedy Space Centre on 18 June 1983 and its crew included Sally Ride, America's first female astronaut.
Kazsat1	KazSat-1 is the first communications satellite launched from Kazakhstan. It was launched on 17 June 2006. Partial control of the satellite was lost in July 2008 and completely in October 2008. It was supposed to serve for 10 years, but already on 26 November 2008, due to a failure in the on-board digital system, it stopped responding to control signals. The failure was declared irreversible, and in August 2009, the satellite was transferred to a burial orbit.

World Blood Donor Day 14 June 2022

Blood transfusions

This medical procedure has saved countless lives since it was first introduced in the 17th century, but it took the carnage of World War One to bring the blood transfusion into regular use.



World War One was a catalyst for increased blood banks and transfusions. The man to thank, USA army doctor Captain Oswald Robertson, saw the potential in transfusions to aid any wounded troops on the battlefield. Early transfusions were made directly from person to person, unlike today, when donated blood is administered from a pouch via a drip. Captain Robertson also set up a blood bank on the Western Front in 1917, using sodium citrate to stop the blood coagulating. Blood was also kept frozen for 28 days and sent to medical stations where it could be used in surgery. It proved a success and saw more blood banks set up as the use of transfusions increased. Leningrad in Russia was the site of the first ever non-military blood bank in 1932. In the UK the National Blood Service was formed in 1946 as the National Blood Transfusion Service of England and Wales (NBTS).
