# Magic trick of the week – try this!!!

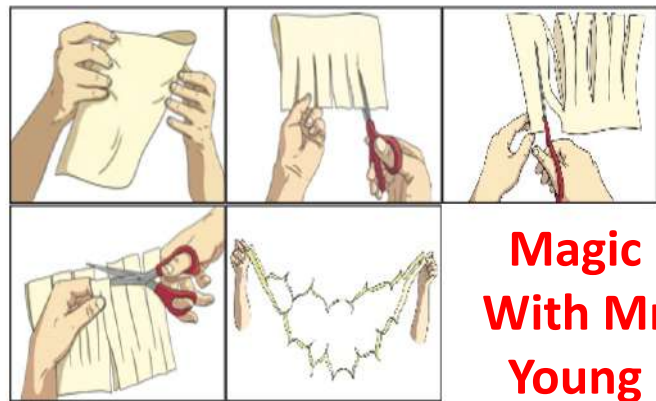


## 16. Stepping through paper trick

This is a fantastic trick that will truly amaze your audience, proving that you can, in fact, walk through a piece of paper without ripping it in two. It is very simple but very clever. Give it a go.

### How to do the trick:

- 1: Start by betting your audience that you can step through a piece of A4 paper without ripping it or tearing it in half.
- 2: Take a A4 sheet of paper and fold it in half.
- 3: Cut a series of strips in the paper, starting from the side with the folded crease. Be careful not to cut right to the end of the paper. (See image.)
- 4: Once you have finished cutting the strips, turn the piece of paper over and start cutting strips in the opposite direction, making sure again that you do not cut to the end of the paper.
- 5: Now all that is left to do is to snip the folds at the top of the strips on the crease except for the folds on the first and last strips.
- 6: Say the magic word **ah haaa** - open the paper out and carefully step through!

## We have been studying 'The instruments of the Orchestra' this half term.

Have you liked what you have heard?



There are spaces available to learn a variety of instruments with us at CCSC, starting as soon as after the Easter holiday.

**The Woodwind Family:** you can learn recorder - flute - oboe - clarinet - saxophone - bassoon (Maybe look them up and listen to their sounds if you don't know what some of them are!)



**The brass Family:** trumpet, trombone, French horn and tuba.



**The string family:** Violin, viola, cello Double bass.

**Percussion family:** anything you hit – from djembes to the drum kit.



Don't forget the **piano and the voice.**

Children would be expected to sign up for at least the remainder of the year and can continue lessons while at CCSC. The cost is heavily subsidised by school and as a general rule much cheaper than private lessons. Lessons are weekly in term time with practice required between lessons.

Instruments are available to hire for free, there may be some cost for reeds and tutor books.

Anybody can learn and playing a musical instrument is proven to help all learning. As a colleague once said - you never find a stupid musician!

# When are my Exams?

## REVISE How To Revise/Recap

- Summarise**
  - Read a topic/chapter/page and summarise into 5 bullet points.
- 5 Questions**
  - Read the topic/chapter/page and write your own 5 questions with answers.
- Definitions**
  - Pick 5 keywords and write the meaning.
- Picture**
  - Draw a diagram/picture and label it to explain what it shows
- Video**
  - Watch a SHORT video on YouTube on a topic/keyword/concept and pause it at appropriate times to make 5 bullet points.
- Quiz**
  - Find 10 questions on kahoot, booklet or educake, answer them and make notes on anything you learn or need to remember.
- Mind Map**
  - Pick a topic and draw a mind map explaining 10 key points.
- Copy**
  - Pick a topic and read the crucial knowledge.  
Copy 5 sentences that you don't remember or understand.
- Memory**
  - Look at the crucial knowledge for 30 seconds. Cover it up and write down everything you can remember in 30 seconds. Repeat 3 times.
- Flash Card**
  - Pick a topic/chapter/page and on the front of the flash card write 5 keywords/phrases or pictures and on the back write what they mean.
- Exam Questions/Past Papers**
  - Pick a topic and answer exam questions. Ensure you use a mark scheme to check your answers. Past Papers can be found online and downloaded.
- Worksheets/Workbooks**
  - Pick a topic and complete a placemat or worksheet on that topic. Ask your teacher and they will print/send you lots. Use your memory first and then use other resources such as the crucial knowledge to help you.

## Revision Strategies

- Brain Dump**  
Choose a topic and write down as much as you can remember, without referring to your notes. Check your notes and see what you missed then try fill the gaps without the notes. Check your notes a third time and add the missing information.
- Flash Cards**  
Write flash cards for each topic, in all subjects, then mix them up for the most effective revision. Check out the Leitner System for effective spacing and interleaving. Keep your flash cards simple – one question, one answer per card.
- Map It out**  
Take an essay question or writing question and map out your answer, without writing a full response. Look at the mark scheme and decide if your plan meets the criteria. DO this for a number of questions, then choose one and write the full response.
- Past Papers**  
Ask your teacher for practice questions or exam papers or find them on the exam board website. Complete them without notes in the exam conditions, then check you answers and identify the gaps in your knowledge, so you can target your revision.
- Quizzes**  
Write a set of questions and answers and ask someone to test you. Its important to either write or say your answers loud. Reading through quizzes in your head can give you a false sense of security.
- Thinking Hard: Reduce**  
Read a section of your notes then put them aside and reduce what you need into 3 bullet points, each one no more than 10 words. Look back at the notes and decide if you missed anything important. Hide the notes and write a fourth bullet point.
- Practice Introductions**  
For essay subjects, take a past exam question and practice writing effective introductions and conclusion. Look back at your notes and remind yourself of the important things to remember. Practice for different topics, texts and papers.
- Thinking Hard: Connect**  
For each subject, consider the exam paper and group together questions that require the same technique to answer. Write down the requirements for each type. Find a previous example you have completed and identify where you've met the criteria.
- Thinking Hard: Transform**  
Read a paragraph from your notes or a text book, and transform it into a diagram, chart or sketch – no words allowed. OR Look a diagram in science, for example, and transform it into a paragraph of explanation.
- Key Vocabulary**  
For a particular topic, make a list of key vocabulary, then do the following: define each word; use each term in a sentence; create a question where the key word is the answer; identify other words which connect to each of the words in your list.

The aim is to develop pupils' understanding and long-term memory of the crucial knowledge, supporting their learning and developing their overall progress. # St Georges Day 23 April 2023.

St. George's Day is celebrated on 23 April 2023, and is England's national day- Admired for his bravery and Christian faith the patron saint of England has captivated British imaginations since medieval times and been adopted into myth, as a dragon slayer. Very little is known about St. George's life, but it is thought he was a high-ranking officer in the Roman army of Turkish/Greek origin who was executed in around AD 303.

The Emperor Diocletian is said to have had St. George tortured to make him deny his faith in Christ. However, despite some of the most terrible torture even for that time, St George showed incredible courage and faith and was finally beheaded near Lydda in Palestine. His head was later taken to Rome where it was interred in the church dedicated to him. As a Christian martyr he is also celebrated by Christian churches, countries and cities of which he is the patron saint, including England, Bulgaria, Georgia, Portugal, Romania, Caceres, Alcoy, Aragon and Catalonia.

King Edward III made him the Patron Saint of England when he formed the Order of the Garter in St. George's name in 1350, and the cult of the Saint was further advanced by King Henry V, at the battle of Agincourt (1415) in northern France. Shakespeare in around 1599 then made sure that nobody would forget St. George, and has King Henry V finishing his pre-battle speech with the famous phrase, 'Cry God for Harry, England and St. George!'

In the UK St Andrew's Day (as patron saint of Scotland) and St Patrick's Day in Northern Ireland (as patron saint of Ireland) are public holidays.

St George's Day and St David's Day are not marked as holidays in England and Wales respectively. Arguably, St Georges Day is the patron saint's day least acknowledged in its own country.

British society is one of the most secularised (non-religious) in the world and in modern times in England, in particular, appears to have forgotten or rejected St George as a national symbol.
